Restoration Workdays



Join other volunteers as they care for the conservancy. Volunteers are notified via email, signs along the trail, and regularly

scheduled dates on the FOPB calendar. Regularly scheduled work dates are the first Wednesday and third Saturday from 9:00 am to noon. Locations vary so get your name on the email list. Upcoming work dates are on the website www.pheasantbranch.org.

Adopt-A-Plot

Adopt a small section of the Conservancy! It might be a tree or a group of trees. Work with friends, family, neighbors, colleagues from work, organizations or even by yourself. You are encouraged to visit your plot once or twice a month to remove invasive species and keep a log of your work so that we have a record of what you did and when. Members of the Restoration and Management Committee are on call for questions.

Become a Naturalist

If you have experience working with K-12 students or enjoy presenting for groups about environmental topics, join our naturalist team! Help us

lead field trips for over 1,500 students each year. Curriculum based lesson plans and materials are provided.



Training and orientation are offered. We pay naturalists a stipend for each field trip.

Join a Committee

Restoration & Management: Work with the City of Middleton Public Lands Department and Dane County Parks Department to develop restoration goals. Members meet four times a year to review goals and schedule work dates.

Education: Help direct our Kids for the Earth program under the leadership of the part-time education coordinator. Bring your skills and ideas about how to sponsor field trips, community Conservancy Day programs, teacher trainings and more. Help develop new initiatives. Meet a few times per year.

Become a board member: The board meets monthly to set policy and monitor programs and projects in the Conservancy.
